Parent Consultations

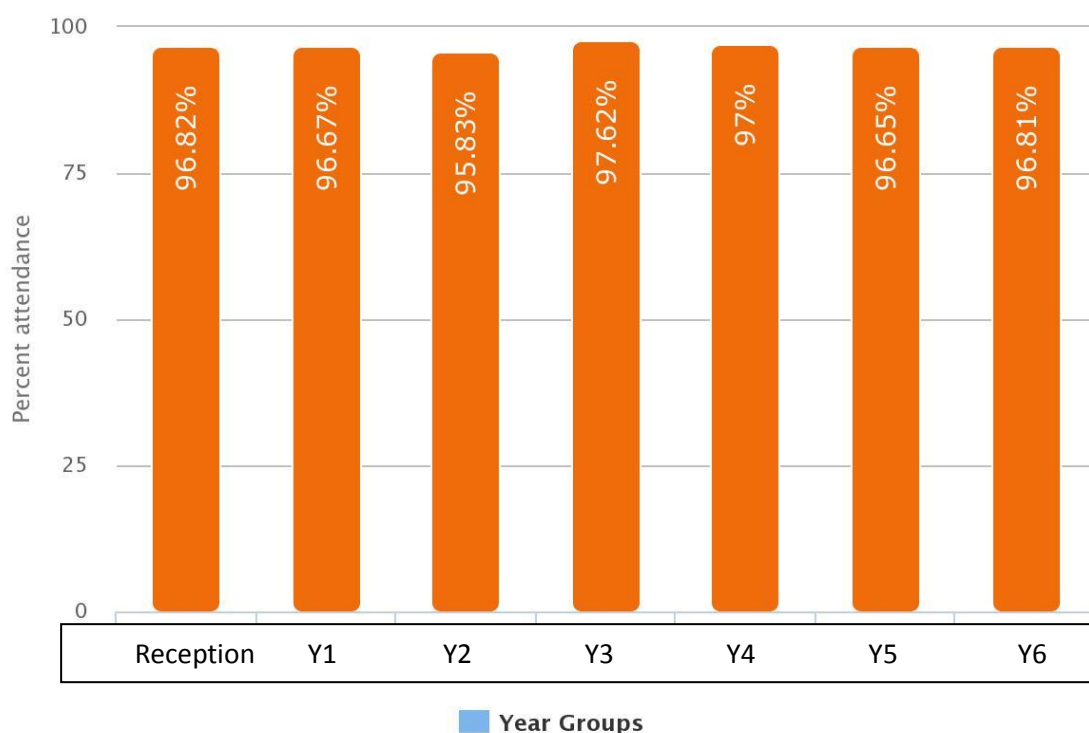
Letters will be out next week for parent consultations. Please do return these as soon as possible so that we ensure all parents have the opportunity to meet staff.
