Challenging outdoor experiences promote the development of communication, problem solving and decision making skills which have currency across a range of occupations. They encourage a positive "opting in" and "can do" attitude. Young people's horizons are broadened, new challenges come to be relished rather than shunned, and perseverance and determination are reinforced. I hope that our children begin to have a different outlook after these couple of days and become more independent, and resilient translating the 'can do' attitude to their learning and in other areas of life.

Please collect water bottles


