Parking – Good news!

<u>QES</u> and the <u>Lunesdale Sports Centre</u> have kindly agreed to let parents park in front of the Sports Hall at drop off times. This is to encourage people to avoid parking on Kendal Road from the bus stop out towards the A65 as there have already been several near misses between children and moving vehicles.

The parking along the side of the Astro Turf is a QES staff car park, please don't block these spaces or park in front of the astro turf gates - access is required all of the time. If you do park in front of the sports hall, you are allowed to walk across the astro turf as long as there are no lessons or games taking place.

As the year progresses, more Sixth Formers will be passing their driving tests and driving to school. This means there will be fewer parking spaces available in the summer months.

It is important that we respect this very generous offer and do not cause any unnecessary problems for the staff or visitors to the secondary school.
