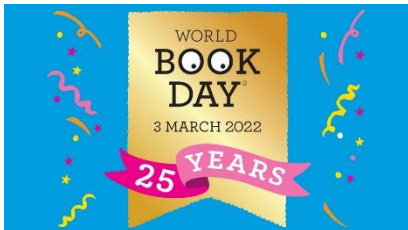
Sponsored Event – Stuart Robinson MBE

World Book Day



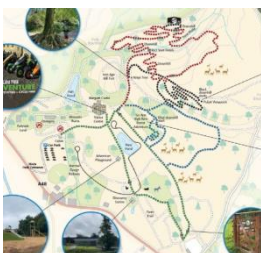
