Amber warning

The Met Office has issued an Amber heat warning for Cumbria for early next week.

Hot weather is now expected in many parts of Cumbria on Monday 18 and Tuesday 19 July, with temperatures in some parts of Cumbria expected to exceed 30°C.

Public Health have issued advice the following advice for schools and early years settings to manage the effects of high heat.

Please note:

- Please have water bottles
- Please ensure a very high factor sun cream is applied before school
- Always wear a hat – please ensure your child arrives in a hat
- Consider wearing: Shorts not trousers
- Children will not need to wear jumpers/hoodies



Dear Parents,




