Dear Parents,

As you may be aware, the National Education Union (NEU), have held ballots of their members on industrial action on Wednesday 1st Feb 2023. I am writing to you today to reassure you about what might take place and what this will mean for your child. Striking is the right of every teacher who is part of a union and is a personal choice, which we respect as a school. We are committed to the right of all workers to take action and stand up for better funding, conditions and funded pay awards, whatever their sector. We also believe that our children's education should be properly funded.

It is our primary responsibility to ensure our pupils receive the highest standard of education and care. It is our feeling that the impact of this particular strike would not be felt by government but by the children, families and colleagues in our community. Following two and a half years of lockdowns, we do not wish to inflict more upheaval, cost and stress on our families or on our Teaching Assistants. As such, please rest assured that we have comprehensive plans in place should strike action go ahead to ensure your child can continue their studies. We will endeavour, where possible, regardless of national industrial action to have sufficient staff on site to welcome our children. I can confirm that Young Voices (Manchester) will go ahead as planned.








Dear Parents,

Our annual Spelling Bee is approaching at the beginning of February and we will be sending out our spelling lists for all of the children from Reception to Year 6. We always choose January to try to improve our spellings whilst having some fun together. Children learn spellings and represent their school house on the day. This is an excellent way to try to learn some of the more tricky spellings that children are required to learn by the end of their year.



The best way to start with this is to identify words that the children can already spell, highlight these and then target spellings that are perhaps trickier to learn. A few each week will allow the children to learn these steadily and methodically. These can be learned verbally, creatively – in any way the children like to enable the spellings to be remembered.

We know various children find spellings challenging as a result of dyslexia or for other reasons. This provides a focus to say let's have a go and work on spellings and overcome some barriers. You will notice (and it will not come as a surprise) that the spellings are similar to the age expectations for that year group. By the time children get to Year 6 some children even exceed the most challenging words see in the list above.
