Safety - School Parking

The children's safety is of paramount importance, and as a Governing body we do all we can to support the School leadership team in ensuring all children have safe and easy access to the school.

It has come to my attention, as the Governor for Health & Safety, that there is currently an increased risk during drop-off and pick-up times. Cars are being left unattended in undesignated areas, or blocking the route for staff members cars, delivery vehicles etc..

The school car-park if for staff only, and should not be used by parents. The school has created a drop-off area in the pull-in area. Simply drop-off or collect your child and please pull-off straightaway, so the space can be used for someone else. Please do not park in this drop-off area or leave your car for any length of time.

If you are needing to pop-into the school with your child or you are planning on meeting up with other parents, we suggest that you use the Booths car park and walk up to the school, as this car park is now free for up to one hour. Parking at Booths is now easier than ever. You do not need a ticket, as the car park simply uses Parking-Eye to determine your entry and exit time.

We do also politely ask that if you are in walking distance to the school, that you consider walking to and from school, as this is beneficial to health and the environment, not to mention a saving in fuel.

Lastly a quick reminder, that due to the volume of traffic surrounding both QES and St Mary's the council, highways and Police do routinely monitor the area for illegal parking etc. Therefore, we do ask all parents to not park on double yellow lines or park in a manner that would block emergency vehicles, neighbours vehicles, etc...
