As some secondary schools situated within Westmorland and Furness Council are expecting a large intake of year 7 students, we really want to avoid any issues or disappointment come the start of the Autumn Term 2024.

Please can parents/carers be notified that the deadline for applications is the **31**st **May 2024.** For any applications submitted after this date, transport may not be in place for the beginning of the Autumn Term; usually due to the lack of available seats on vehicles.


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
